WeCar™, Car Sharing by Enterprise Rent-A-Car®, Launches in Downtown St. Louis

*St. Louis Car Sharing Cooperative, Elected Officials,
Join to Unveil Enterprise's Environmentally Friendly WeCar Offering*

February 12, 2008 (St. Louis, Missouri) – Enterprise Rent-A-Car and the St. Louis Car Sharing Cooperative, led by Citizens for Modern Transit, have teamed up to bring a new, environmentally friendly transportation option to downtown St. Louis. Today, at 11:30 a.m. outside Metropolitan Square at 211 N. Broadway, the Downtown St. Louis Partnership will host a program launch and ribbon cutting for WeCar by Enterprise Rent-A-Car.

With WeCar, St. Louisans who live and work downtown can rent hybrid cars by the hour. Metropolitan Square is one of the nine WeCar rental locations in the downtown area.

“Enterprise’s WeCar program will provide people who take transit to work or live downtown the freedom of having an automobile without the hassle and expense of driving and parking downtown,” said Tom Shrout, Executive Director of Citizens for Modern Transit. “For example, downtown dwellers, employees who carpool, or those who use mass transit can utilize the WeCar program for everything from personal errands to family emergencies.”

Shrout adds, the program is a great new option for the Guaranteed Ride Home Program’s 7,000 registered transit riders. With the recent closure of Highway 40, commuters are looking for new solutions, and car sharing provides another alternative to those who live downtown and to those who need to traverse St. Louis throughout their work day.

The St. Louis Car Sharing Cooperative includes the following organizations: Citizens for Modern Transit; the Downtown St. Louis Community Improvement District; Pyramid-Spinnaker, LLC; LoftWorks; The Syndicate; and Lawrence Group 1, Inc.

Enterprise has been offering hourly rentals in several cities, such as Chicago, New York, and Washington, D.C. However, this is the first time that cars are strategically placed in parking spaces around the city; accessed electronically by participants; and booked online and available 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

“This is a great opportunity and we are thrilled to be rolling out this new program and technology right here in our hometown,” said Tony Moise, Vice President and General Manager of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in St. Louis. “Through our work with our partners and local political leaders, we know there is a demand for the WeCar program. We are already in the neighborhoods, near our customers, and providing these types of customized solutions is a natural extension of our business. And, as part of our company’s commitment to environmental sustainability, these hybrids are the perfect vehicle for this community-based program.”

The WeCar vehicles will be parked in designated spots near some of the city’s largest employers, close to busy residential areas, and near public transportation and high-traffic areas. This is the first car sharing program in St. Louis available to the general public. In January, Enterprise rolled out WeCar at Washington University.

“We are excited to work with the WeCar program” said Larry Williams, St. Louis City Treasurer. “As housing, retail and office space continue to revitalize downtown, employers and residents have looked for alternative options to reduce parking concerns and to better utilize mass transit. Our collaboration with this program is evidence of our support for creative solutions that address the need for downtown parking.”

Anyone can participate in the WeCar program, including employers, employees, and residents. Membership costs \$35 per year, and sign-up begins today. Interested participants can visit www.WeCar.com/stl to enroll.

Jim Cloar, President and CEO of the Downtown St. Louis Partnership, added, “WeCar is a solution for many downtown employees, urban residents, and others seeking to limit vehicle ownership, reduce congestion, and address environmental concerns resulting from the use of vehicles in densely populated areas. The all-hybrid car sharing program is environmentally friendly, providing convenience, flexibility, and cost savings to its members.”

The nine vehicles are all Toyota Prius hybrids. The WeCar program at Washington University is also an all-hybrid program, comprised of four Prius hybrids, and two Ford Escape hybrids. In addition, Enterprise has the world’s largest fleet of fuel-efficient vehicles, with nearly half averaging a highway fuel efficiency rating of 28 mpg or better. Some 264,000 of the company’s vehicles have earned the U.S. EPA’s **Smartway** certification mark – a distinction the EPA grants to vehicles that emit relatively low levels of both regulated pollutants and greenhouse gases such as CO₂.
